We continue to have a very successful Art Camp every summer and we have many volunteers to thank as well as the people of Bear Island for making it a very special week for our young people. A particular thank you to Marvyn Morrison and his daughter Caitlin for funding the Art Camp for the past two years.

In April 2010, the Foundation is planning a special fundraising gathering in Toronto. We have assembled a fabulous Fundraising Committee to steer the event and have lined up a r for the evening. We will be sending out invitations in the New Year and promise an interesting

What brings us together is the desire to preserve and enrich the lands of Temagami and the lives of the people who live here, full or part-time. Our efforts to do so require fresh thinking, a spirit of collaboration, energy, perseverance, and, of course, money.

We rely on your first-time or continuing donations to finance innovative, critical initiatives that benefit all of us. Your dollars fund projects and organizations whose missions dovetail with ours. That mission is to:

- 1. Promote environmental stewardship and awareness
- 2. Support community arts and culture
- 3. Honour First Nation heritage
- 4. Foster sustainable community economic development

You can decide how your contributions will be put to use.

- Donations of cash (or securities) can become a part of the Temagami Community Foundation Endowment which funds
 grant requests annually. Please consider even small donations; they most certainly build up over time and demonstrate
 community support for the Foundation.
- The Foundation is planning to partner with others in Temagami on a major "Water Quality" initiative. We have applied for a Federal EcoAction grant and have the enthusiastic support of a number of participants. Over the next two years the project is expected to require \$180,000 of cash and in-kind support, of which we will need to raise \$20,000. Can you help us with a donation specifically for this project? Water quality in Temagami is everyone's responsibility.
- Donors can become part of the Temagami Community Foundation's Council of 100 with a contribution of \$5000, which may be paid in full or in installments. The \$500,0000 to be raised by this campaign will provide an enduring base for the grant-making power of the TCF, and the Council of 100 members continue to stand out as leaders united by their shared commitment to Temagami.
