Mary McTavish, TCF Arts Camp Director

Former Muskoka resident and cottager, Mary McTavish, was introduced to, and fell in love with, Temagami back when she partnered with Dave MacDonald. Dave had started his career in the MNR in the Temagami area in the '70's and then moved on to business ventures in the North Bay area. In 2006 Dave and Mary became cottagers on Cassels Lake, and in 2017 moved to Temagami as permanent residents.

Last autumn I sat with Mary in her Temagami home and it was there that I first learned of her enthusiasm for and commitment to community service. Mary shared insights gained from 20+ years of volunteer work with families and communities in Orillia.

To our great delight, Mary graciously accepted the invitation to join the board of the TCF, and, to still our hearts, take on the role of 2019 Summer Arts Camp director!

I recently had the opportunity to sit down with Mary again for a delicious dinner at Temagami Shores to talk about her first few months on the TCF board. Over the course of our conversation I was struck by the ways in which Mary's vision for this year's Arts Camp melds so seamlessly with the TCF's commitment to the harmony and sustainability of community and culture.

As the new Arts Camp director for the 2019 summer, Mary's goal is to



provide the space and support to bring together the youth of our constituent communities. Arts Camp is an opportunity for young people from the town, the First Nation, and the cottages to use creative processes to share their individual lived experiences and to build relationships that strengthen interconnection. Arts Camp FAQ



Q: Where and when is Arts Camp this year?

A: Arts Camp takes place at the Laura McKenzie Learning Centre on Bear Island. Camp will run from July 1 through July 5. Camp starts at 10AM and finishes at 3PM. Off-the-lake students meet at the Temagami Train Station at 8:45AM daily. The bus will arrive at the Access Road Dock for 9:30AM and a boat shuttle will ferry students the rest of the way to camp. Upon dismissal the boat shuttle will take students to meet the bus at the Access Road Dock for 3:30PM and then back to the Temagami Train Station for 4:15PM.

Q: What age children can attend?

A: Camp is open for children ages 6 to 12.

Q: What will my children do at Arts Camp?

A: Painting, carving, dance, drama... so many forms of creative expression! Participants draw from experience and imagination, as they practice visualization and follow through to transform an idea into a work of art. They share stories, lend a hand across the table, and build friendships in a supportive and creative environment.

Q: Who staffs Arts Camp?

A: This event proudly relies on, and encourages, volunteers from these three communities. It is able to open its doors each summer as a direct result of the generous contributions of effort and energy from friends and neighbours who volunteer their time. The Temagami Community Foundation is a registered charitable organization. It invests funds entrusted to it and makes grants from the income earned. These grants provide direct support to individuals and groups within our community who seek to expand and improve quality of life here in town and on the lake.

Grants can only be made for charitable purposes, primarily in these areas:

- Environmental awareness and stewardship
- Community arts and culture
- First Nations
- Sustainable community economic development programs

Grants are made to registered charities or, in certain cases, to applicants sponsored by a qualified donee (a registered charity, a municipality, a qualified First Nation community, etc).

The Temagami Community Foundation normally funds projects that:

- Meet an obvious community need within the Foundation's mission
- Promote community discussion and dialogue
- Foster shared responsibility and common well-being
- Involve volunteers
- Create excitement in the community

The TCF Grants Committee will soon be announcing the 2019 grant cycle calendar and will be accepting applications.
