Dear TCF Members and Friends,

2020 has certainly been a challenging year for everyone with the COVID-19 pandemic affecting all of our lives. At the Temagami Community Foundation (TCF), we take pride in the role that we have played this year in several areas. Community grants has been one area where we have been very active thanks in large part to two grants that we received from Community Foundations Canada (CFC). The CFC was given the responsibility to distribute funds that were provided by the Government of Canada for a program to support people affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The program is called the Emergency Community Support Fund. The Temagami Community Foundation applied to the CFC under this program and was awarded an initial grant of \$60,000 followed by an additional \$35,000 grant!

In addition to this, TCF also had \$35,000 to grant from our boat & truck lottery and from the endowment. So, in total we had \$130,000 to grant in 2020 to various nonprofit organizations in Temagami. All of this money will be distributed by yearend. The organizations that we have made grants to include the Temagami & Area Fish Improvement Program, the Temagami Library, the Temagami Family Health Team, the Marten River and Temagami Fire Departments, the Temagami Lions Club, the Temagami Legion, Living Temagami, the Temagami Public School and the Temagami Seniors Home Support.

All of these grants were only possible because of the existence of the Temagami Community Foundation. We are probably one of the smallest communities in Canada to have a foundation. I hope that you agree with us that our foundation is a very important part of the Temagami community. We are only twenty years old and we are growing every year. We hope that you will consider donating to the Temagami Community Foundation so that we can continue the good work. Thank you.


A warm and heartfelt welcome to Ashley Blais! It is with great excitement that we announce Ashley has joined the TCF as our incoming Administrator.

We here at the TCF are delighted to join the Temagami community in congratulating our board member Sandra Laronde for her many career achievements, two of which were celebrated this fall. In late October the Toronto Arts Foundation (TAF) honored Laronde with the Celebration of Cultural Life Award.

Anne Dion noted in The Dance Current magazine "...this year's award recognizes Laronde's lifelong dedication to the arts and arts education, noting, as well, Red Sky's international impact. The company has toured since 2003 in 17 countries on four continents."

TAF director Claire Hopkinson noted "As the world grapples with the effects of COVID-19, we are seeing more and more people looking to the arts for hope and inspiration. Artists like Sandra are leading the pack as their work celebrates not only the life that we still have in our everyday but also the lives that we look forward to in the future following the pandemic. This award is about inspiration and celebration – two things that the artists of Toronto hold at their very core."

In an interview published in The Star, Laronde said that recognition like this is a milestone for her. "I feel so grateful to be acknowledged in this way ... It couldn't come at a better time than in the middle of a pandemic. We've all been somewhat pummelled during this time of devastating impact in the arts sector. I have to say I'm so impressed by people who don't get swallowed up by negativity, but remain resourceful and remarkable in their will to keep moving forward," she said.

Part of the resourcefulness of which Laronde speaks was a pivot to virtual productions like *Mistatim*, a piece performed live via Zoom to an audience of over 700 including many Temagami-area youth and families as the kick-off event for the TCF's 2020 Virtual Arts Camp.

The TAF award came on the heels of another exciting honor for Laronde and Red Sky; the invitation to participate in Canadian Trade Mission trip to Europe in 2021 with many other arts leaders from across the country.


She noted in an interview with Jamie Mountain of the Timiskaming

Speaker that the trip would entail going to Amsterdam in The Netherlands and meeting presenters "who are looking for productions and opportunities to work with Canada", and more specifically, to work with her company, Red Sky Performance.


"I see my role very much as a diplomatic one when I'm travelling all over the world," she said.
"...what a wonderful opportunity to do business with Europe and to see the different countries, cultures, and ways of being."




## THE PORTRAITS ARE HOME
